WHYY A WINNER OF 22 AWARDS FROM PENNSYLVANIA, DELAWARE NEWS MEDIA ASSOCIATIONS

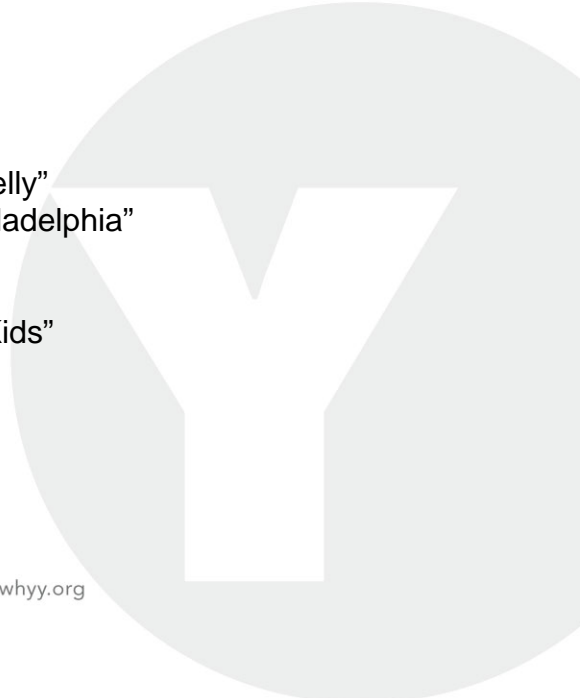
